25th January is the foundation day of Election Commission of India. It is on this day in the year 1950 Election Commission of India was founded. Constitution of India, under Article 324, empowers the Election Commission to conduct Elections to the Parliament, State Legislatures and to the offices of President and Vice-President.

In order to make the registration and other processes faster, smoother and error free, submission of applications through online mode through various digital platforms have been encouraged. I am told this time during special summary revision in Assam, more than 76 per cent of applications have been received online. This is a welcome trend.

Under the supervision and control of Election Commission of India, right from the Chief Electoral Officer to District election Officers and his team, officials from many state and central Govt. departments, Police and para-military personnel work together
