Guwahati, February 11: Assam Governor Shri Gulab Chand Kataria inaugurated the 3rd National Barpeta Book and Science Fair at Barpeta today.

Stating that the economic growth of any country depends on the development of science and technology, the Governor said that India has the third largest scientific workforce in the world which has contributed to the emergence of India as the fifth largest of economy of the world.

The Governor, therefore, said, "It is very important that every student of the country gains ever-increasing knowledge of science and technology and its manifestations in the form of innovations, new inventions, new technologies etc. I am sure the book and science fair is a very good platform which arouses curiosity and rekindles creatively among the students and attracts them to explore and learn new things and explore new world, the Governor exhorted.
