

**Governor attends the Graduation Day of Asian Institute of Nursing Education**

The Governor said that the nurses are the torchbearers, the forerunners, the crusaders and the creators of changes. The tender loving care they deliver is the magic that inspires hope, warmth and a sense of ease in the patients. He hailed Asian Institute of Nursing Education for preparing the student in holistic manner and giving them opportunity for personal, social and intellectual development to make them strong health care professional.
